**Pledging Allegiance
Luke 4:1-13**

Today's opening prayer asks God to help us "grow in understanding of the riches hidden in Christ and by worthy conduct pursue their effects." All three readings deal with professing faith in the living God. We move toward pledging our allegiance of faith on Easter.

Lent's journey will take us to the celebration of the paschal mystery of Easter. During these forty days we are invited into a space of sensory deprivation when we gather for worship: no flowers on the altar, no music for its own sake but only to accompany our singing, and no colorful banners that might distract us from the task at hand: to prepare our minds and hearts to renew our baptismal promise during the celebration.

We will be asked both to renounce Satan and all his perks and promises and to place our wholehearted trust in God who created us, in the Son who redeemed us, and in the Spirit who dwells within us and enlightens us. Lent is a serious season but not necessarily a somber one; it is the waiting room for Easter joy. One Lenten Preface (the priest's prayer before the Holy, Holy, Holy) even speaks of it as a season that is a gracious gift from God, making us joyful because we are purified to celebrate the Easter mysteries.

Just as Jesus was tempted throughout his ministry to turn aside from his mission, his followers will be, too. The three temptations speak to our own experience when we seek self-gratification rather than the glory of God.

God's word today calls us to make God our true nourishment, our true wealth, our faithful source of strength, and the solid foundation of our trust. Paul's bold proclamation to the Romans extends to us: the Lord enriches all who call upon Him. All who call on him will be saved.

- *Where do you want to find yourself at the end of this Lenten journey?*
- *What temptation lures you to turn aside from having God and Christ at the center of your life?*

Lord Jesus, as you had the help of the Spirit to turn aside from the temptations that came to you during the time in the desert and the years of your ministry, help us to turn to this same Spirit to help us in our efforts to grow in faith, hope, and charity this Lent.

Are You Ready for Lent?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church also refers to these sins as "capital sins" and explains why they are the most dangerous. "Vices can

be classified according to the virtues they oppose, or also be linked to capital sins which Christian experience has distinguished, following St. John Casian and St. Gregory the Great. They are called "capital" because they engender other sins, other vices. They are pride, avarice (greed), envy, wrath, lust, gluttony and sloth" (No. 1866).

The Seven 7 Deadly Sins

- PRIDE:** an excessive love of self or the desire to be better or more important than others. (No. 1931).
- LUST:** an intense desire, usually for sexual pleasure, but also for money, power, or fame. (No. 2541).
- GLUTTONY:** over-consumption, usually of food or drink. (No. 2290).
- GREED:** the desire for and love of possessions. "Sin...is a failure in genuine love for God and neighbor caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods" (No. 1849).
- SLOTH:** physical laziness, also disinterest in spiritual matter or neglecting spiritual growth. (No. 2302).
- ANGER OR WRATH:** uncontrolled feelings of hatred or rage. (2302).
- ENVY AND JEALOUSY:** sadness or desire for the possessions, happiness, talents, or abilities of another. (No.2553).

Do You Want To Become A Saint?

Another question you must ask yourself is, "Do I want to become a saint?" Worldly freethinkers are uninterested; it's all restrictive and limiting silliness and foolishness to them. It is only the humble who fully grasp the beauty in dying to self with open arms to God, a requirement of sainthood. Others fear that having God means giving up all the pleasures of the world. Unfortunately, they misunderstand what possessing God really means and really is. For instance, we often hear God is love. The mistake we make, however, is in thinking God's love is simply a bigger version of human love, and we know in the depths of our heart any amount of human love, however great, will not satisfy us forever. We have all experienced some kind of pleasurable love from others, whether it be from friendship, paternal or maternal or filial love, human intimacy, and so forth; yet God's love cannot be directly compared to these. Gather all your most pleasurable experiences in life into one. Once touched by God's love, you will realize how

very small and insignificant these fleeting moments really are, for they are as nothing when compared to one Divine Glance lasting but a fraction of a second. To compare human love and the pleasures of earthly life to the intense, fiery heat of the love of God, is to compare but a dim candle flame to the combined heat of all the stars contained in 100 billion galaxies -- and this analogy, too, falls infinitely short.

If you want to have everything, God alone suffices. If you want to experience complete, life-changing and indescribable love, God alone can supply it. There is no substitute for God. There is no experience like the experience of God. If you want to be kissed by the Divine Fire who will burn within your being for eternity, providing continuous warmth and love, companionship and peace, happiness and security, then you will need to give up yourself to God; you will need to become a saint. It is not a way of life for the fickle or for cowards, but rather for the determined and persistent and courageous. It will not be easy, as the cross of Christ clearly reveals, but the rewards are unimaginably great. Do you want that life? Do you want to become a saint?

Above we noted how something radical, at some point, happened in the lives of the saints. Some moment came and passed, leaving them different.

It is as if they were each being tossed about on a stormy sea, when suddenly a sure, certain and loving wind filled their sails, and began to push them along toward a new, unseen yet highly desirable destiny.
